

TPM Ommen (NL) – 20. – 24 October 2024

Day 1 – Sunday, October 20

The final Transnational Project Meeting (TPM6) of the SAVLAR project began with the arrival of participants in Ommen. The team gathered at Hotel De Zon, located near the river and within walking distance of the train station.
